Guidance on Certifying Identification Documents



When applying for a Tyro product, you will be required to provide certified copies of your relevant identification documents. A certified copy means an identification document that has been certified as a true and correct copy of an original document.

To produce a certified copy, you should make a copy of the original document and take the original and the copy to an approved person (see below for who is an approved person).

If any document is written in a language other than English, it must be translated into English by an accredited translator. An 'accredited translator' is a person currently accredited by the National Accreditation Authority for Translators and Interpreters (NAATI) at the level of Professional Translator, or above, to translate from a language other than English into English.

Persons approved to certify copies of original documents

Other professions requiring 2 or more years of continuous service

- · Bank officer with 2 or more years of continuous service
- · Building society officer with 2 or more years of continuous service
- · Credit union officer with 2 or more years of continuous service
- Finance company officer with 2 or more years of continuous service
- A permanent employee of the Australian Postal Corporation who is employed in an office providing postal services to the public and who has 2 or more years of continuous service
- An officer with, or authorised representative of, a holder of an Australian Financial Services Licence, having 2 or more years of continuous service with one or more licensees.
- An officer with, or a credit representative of, a holder of an Australian Credit Licence, having 2 or more years of continuous service with one or more licensees.

Declaration

An approved person must make a declaration as follows on the certified copy:

Single page document

- Write: 'I certify this to be a true and correct copy of the original document sighted by me on [insert date the original document is sighted]'
- · Sign the document
- Print your full name
- State your occupation and any registration number associated with your occupation (if applicable)

Multiple page document

- Write: 'This is a true and correct copy of pages [refer to the page numbers of the original document that has been sighted] of the original document sighted by me on [insert date the original is sighted]'
- · Sign the first page of the document
- Print your full name
- State your occupation and any registration number associated with your occupation (if applicable) on the first page of the document
- · Sign or initial each page of the document subsequent to the first page
